PSYC 316 also is taught by another faculty member, but with entirely different content. It is desirable to have independent courses with independent numbers.

Adding a C- requirement ensures that students have the necessary nimimum level of competence in Introductory and Methods courses to take upper level courses. These upper level courses have statistical and methodological components.
