THEA 685 Stage Rigging, Mechanics, and Automation I THEA 689 Stage Rigging, Mechanics, and Automation II

We have expanded the current course THEA 679 Stage Rigging into a revised two-semester sequence. Logistically, therefore, THEA 679 will need to be deactivated and replaced with the new two-course sequence with new course numbers. The new Roselle Center for the Arts was built purposefully with a state-of-the-art rigging system. Consequently, these expanded courses will allow us to utilize the CFA's capacity in this area and train our students fully in this critical component of technical production. Previously we were unable to offer a sufficient amount of training in the area of rigging, mechanics, and automation due to a lack of appropriate facilities and equipment. These new courses will eliminate the one biggest weakness in the Technical Production curriculum. Now that we have the CFA stage with its rigging system and motorized orchestra pit as a teaching laboratory, as well as some recently acquire component motion control systems and pneumatic devices, we can greatly expand the offerings of the previous THEA 679 Stage Rigging course. It will expand so much so that a two-semester sequence is now appropriate (i.e. THEA 685 Stage Rigging, Mechanics, and Automation II).

- 1. Reduce credits of THEA 665 Theatre Literacy in Year #1 to a total of 2 crs. (1 cr. each semester).
- 2. Reduce credits of THEA 600 Distinctions of Professional Theatre Practice in Years #2 & #3 to a total of 2 crs. (1 cr. each semester, making it the same as it is in Year #1).
- 3. Move THEA 681 Audio Production from Year #1 spring semester to Year #1 fall semester. In its place in Year #1 spring semester put the new course THEA 685 Stage Rigging, Mechanics, and Automation I which is the first course of a new two-semester sequence in this subject area.
- 4. Move THEA 683 Production Project Management from Year #1 fall to Year #2 fall where it will replace the current THEA 679 Stage Rigging which is being deactivated as a course.
- 5. Add new course THEA 689 Stage Rigging, Mechanics, and Automation II to Year #2 fall semester. (This is the second course of a new two-course sequence as described above in #3.)
- 6. Increase credits of THEA 692 Production Preparation & Performance in Year #1 to a total of 4 credits (2 each semester) and in Year #3 for a total of 12 credits (6 each semester).
- 7. Remove THEA 694 Special Topics in Theatre Production from Year #3. (This course is still taught in Year #2; therefore this is not a deactivation of the course. We simply want to remove it from Year #3.)

These changes all reflect a thorough review of our entire curriculum conducted at the end of last year when the 2004-2007 three-year training cycle of the Professional Theatre Training Program (PTTP) concluded.

In the case of #1, #2, #6, and #7 above, we discovered that in these instances our credit distribution and actual classroom hours from the past cycle were not harmonious and that these revisions would rectify the disparities in preparation for our forthcoming 2008-2011 training cycle.

In the case of #3, #4, and #5, moving THEA 681 Audio Production and THEA 683 Production Project Management to different semesters will allow us to begin the new two-course sequence in Stage Rigging, Mechanics, and Automation in Year #1 spring and complete that sequence in Year #2 fall.
