There is one new core course that is required of all students:

EDUC 669, Master's Portfolio: Evaluating Effectiveness (2 credits) This course assists program candidates in evaluating their effectiveness and in constructing the portfolio, which is the capstone requirement for this degree program. Currently, the candidates receive limited guidance in these areas. Many candidates struggle to complete the portfolio within the program time limits set by the university.

There is one course that is required only for students in the School Library Media concentration. Students in this concentration were already required to complete an Internship in School Library Media. They took this course under the EDUC 667 number. We are now seeking a permanent number for this course (EDUC 746).

Additionally, we are adding a concentration in Agriculture Education. In addition to the 15 credits of required coursework, the concentration will contain 18 credits of coursework that already exists in the departments of Agriculture Education, Food and Resource Education, and Statistics. These are not new courses, and this concentration has been developed with the collaboration of our colleagues in Agriculture Education.

The concentration in Agriculture Education has been developed at the request of and with close collaboration from our colleagues in Agriculture Education. This concentration will be tailored to Delaware teachers of Agriculture Education and Cooperative Extension teachers.

### Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

We are seeking four changes to the MI program:

- 1. Change the application deadlines for this program to November 1 for spring semester admission, February 1 for summer session admission, and April 1 for fall semester admission. This will allow our faculty admissions committee to better evaluate the applications. We are currently using the University default deadlines of December 1 and July 1 and have found that this is not enough time to effectively evaluate the applicants.
- 2. We are changing the course number for one required course in the School Library Media Concentration. This has been offered as an experimental number, and we are now requesting a permanent number for this course.
- 3. We are adding a new concentration Agriculture Education at the request and collaboration of the Department of Agricultural Education. Currently, there is no existing masters program that is appropriate for K-12 Agriculture Education teachers. By combining our Education core courses with concentration courses in AGED, FREC, and STAT, this will provide a viable option for Agriculture Education teachers who are interested in improving their practice and/or

preparing for National Board Certification.

4. The objective of the MI program is to improve the practice of current teachers. The culminating activity for the program is the creation of a portfolio that demonstrates the teacher's ability to evaluate his/her effectiveness in the classroom. Currently, candidates complete a 1-credit portfolio course at the end of the program in which they are informed about the required contents of the portfolio. We are proposing a curriculum change that includes moving the 1 credit portfolio course to the beginning of the program so that the candidates can collect the necessary data from their classrooms throughout the program. Further, a new 2-credit portfolio course will be taken at the end of the program. The new course will provide the candidates with guidance in evaluating their effectiveness and in constructing the portfolio. Currently, many candidates struggle to complete the portfolio within the program time limits set by the university. This new course would provide the structure and scaffolding so that the portfolio would be complete by the end of the course.
