Regarding New Courses Required by the Major

Three courses fulfill requirements in the new curriculum. Each is discussed below.

1. GEOG 235: Our original program mistakenly listed the number for the Department's course on "Conservation of Natural Resources." We had GEOG 236 in the catalog when the correct listing should be GEOG 235. We are not changing courses, but correcting an error.
2. APEC 343 as an alternative to POSC 350: After probationary approval of the major, the Department decided to give priority to Department majors. In some semesters, this has meant our majors have not been able to take the course. Several of our majors had taken APEC 343 and recommended it to the Program. The faculty approved its listing as an alternative to the required POSC 350. Attached is an email from the Department giving us permission to list it.
3. ENEP 410 as an alternative to POSC 350: With the approval of the ENEP Program Faculty, this course is now listed as an alternative.
