Hi Steve, I have tried to reply to the items below. Regards, John

- Identify any courses that are included in the revised version that were not in the original – you will need letters of approval for these courses.

REPLY: The attached table sent in an earlier email identifies one course. We received an email confirmation from the faculty member (Josh Duke) who checked with his dept before confirming by email that is fine to list the course.

- Should the number of credits be 60 and not 62, before the second writing course is taken?

REPLY: The number of credits should be 60 before taking the 2nd writing course. There was a typo indicating 62.

- Confirm there is no foreign language requirement in CAS for this major.

REPLY: There is no foreign language requirements. One concentration (EES) includes the option of foreign language study as part of a student's fulfillment of the concentration requirements.

- Rewrite the CAS Breadth requirements in a format consistent with other majors in the college.

REPLY: Our Academic Support Coordinator discussed this with CAS and was informed that the format conforms with CAS policy.

- Consider adding APEC 150 as an "or" to ECON 101 in the core as this is done in other environmental majors.

REPLY: This proposal has been made to the Program Faculty and will be acted upon but not before the end of the academic year. It will then need to go before the CAS Faculty Senate.

- Consider adding STAT 200 as an "or" to MATH 201 as this is done in many majors.

REPLY: The Program Faculty has agreed to this and CAS advises that there is no issue with this.

- Require or at least recommend a minimum mathematics requirement as many of the core and elective courses will require mathematics.

REPLY: The major has a mathematics minimum: MATH 114, to be taken by all majors. There are additional requirements by concentration: EST requires MATH 241; EEP and EES expect MATH 201 or STAT 200.

- The ENEP information refers to the "Registration Book". It would be more accurate for "class listings" to be listed instead since there is no registration booklet, which might be confusing to students.

REPLY: We are changing this language in the forthcoming registration book.

- Identify any courses that are included in the revised version that were not in the original – you will need letters of approval for these courses.
