HLPR 430 – Behavior Change Strategies & Tactics – this course replaces BHAN 422 – Organization &

Administration of Leisure Services, which is no longer being offered. Please see attached a letter of support from Dr. P. Michael Peterson, Department Chairperson. HLPR 430 was agreed upon as a substitution for BHAN 422 by Dr. Peterson and Ms. Suzanne Clark, the previous assistant dean.

HLTH 411 – Topics in Health. This course is being proposed for the 2015-2016 academic year as a variable topics course on selected issues and problems related to individual or population health. This course is being added as an option to the NURS 411 or 412 requirement as some topics in the NURS courses are not appropriate for non-nursing students limiting student options. HLTH 411 is intended to serve as a vehicle for inter-professional education in the health sciences, so students from many majors in the college will be eligible to register.

None of the proposed changes affect the manner in which the 10 goals are already being addressed.

The chairperson of the Department of Behavioral Health & Nutrition supports the replacement of BHAN 422 with HLPR 430 as noted by the attached letter of support. No other units are affected by the remaining proposed changes.

Describe the rationale for the proposed program change(s):

The following program changes are being proposed:

- 1. HLPR 430 to replace the deactivated BHAN 422 (rationale noted above).
- 2. HLTH 411 to be added to the NURS 411/412 requirement for the major (rationale noted above).
- 3. HLTH courses to be added to the departments from which students may select courses to fulfill the 15cr of restricted electives. Rationale the restricted electives portion of the major requires students to select coursework from departments in the college. Adding HLTH to the list of departments is in line with this expectation. When the major was first developed only HLTH 241 and HLTH 495 existed and both are currently included in the curriculum. Over the past few years new courses have been added and others are currently being proposed.

The following clarifications to the curriculum are being formalized:

- 1. The notation "May overlap with University requirements" is being added under "Department Breadth Requirements" to clarify what is already in practice that students may count courses satisfying University requirements (University breadth, Multicultural, etc.) toward the department breadth requirements. When the curriculum was revised in 2011 to account for the University Breadth requirements, this was not made clear; the notation will eliminate confusion among students and faculty.
- 2. Ten credits of coursework from the Mathematics, Natural Sciences, & Technology are required as part of Department Breadth and may also include MATH courses at the 100-level (113, 114, 115, or 117). The Health Sciences major (and Health Studies before it) always permitted 100-level MATH courses to count toward this requirement but this was not clarified. This is in line with selected other majors in the college.
