Dr. Mason:

## In response for additional information on the RN-MSN with a concentration in Health Services Administration, see the comments in bold faced italics.

Your proposal to add a Concentration in Health Services Administration for the RN to MSN in Nursing was reviewed by the Faculty Senate Graduate Studies Committee at its meeting on January 22, 2008, with the following comments and recommendations:

1) We had difficulty in clearly understanding where the proposed concentration was placed in the major. Any steps to help clarify the proposal to the readers are recommended. On the academic program approval form, please state the current degree under the fifth item on the form (I believe it is BSN/MSN). **This is correct. We had written BSN and MSN. Both degrees are awarded at the same time.** 

## The proposal now has highlighted the essential changes in the proposal. The RN-MSN Policy manual has the changes highlight on pages 12 and 17.

2) Please include a copy proposed for the catalog with all changes and corrections as well as where the concentration is described. Please review the current catalog copy for errors. One example on page 316 is the statement mid-way in the right column says "Eight credits from among the following CNS specialty courses are required" when the number in the column is 6. Corrects have been made as well as an update of changes approved by Faculty Senate in the Fall of 2007.

3) In the proposal and catalog copy, please separate what the specific requirements are for the HSAD concentration from the requirements for obtaining the degree without the concentration. All MSN programs have a specialty concentration and include Adult Health, Psychiatry/Mental Health Nursing, and Pediatrics as clinical specialties. This proposal is to add a concentration in Health Services Administration which is a non clinical degree. The health services administration concentration students take 4 core theoretical and one administration practicum. For example, the proposal lists 3 credits of a COMM 600 level course, but it is not clear whether this is a requirement just for the concentration or for all majors in this program. A COMM 600 level course is only for the Health Services Administration concentration and we have highlighted this in the proposal. Also, the committee wants to know if this proposed concentration in HSAD is associated with any certification requirements.

# Graduates of the Health Services Administration concentration are eligible to sit for certification from

(a) the American Nurses Credentialing Center as a Basic (baccalaureate or higher degree) or Advanced Nursing Administration (master's or higher degree) and both require 24 months of full-time practice within the last 5 years as a nurse manager or nurse executive.

(b) Long-term Care Administration certification which varies from state to state in terms of degree and/internship. Requirements vary widely from a minimum of a baccalaureate degree with 6 months internship to a master's degree with 12 months internship in long-term care.

(c) For the American College of Health Executives certification: Through 12/31/08, a bachelor's degree is acceptable and a healthcare management position and two years of healthcare management experience or if applying without a post baccalaureate degree, you must have eight years of experience by 12/31/08

# Certification to practice health care or nursing administration is not required in any state. As far as we know, 10 of our MSN administration graduates have taken a certification exam and all have passed it on the first try.

4) In the RN to MSN policy manual that was sent to me on Jan. 30 by Karen Avino, there are listed two specialties that are similar in format to the four specialties in the standard MSN program. In the RN to MSN program, which is listed in the catalog as Master of Science in Nursing for the Registered Nurse (BSN/MSN), one specialty is Clinical Nurse Specialist (Clinical Nurse Specialist has concentrations in Adult Health, Psychiatric/Mental Health, and Pediatrics. We are proposing to add a concentration in Health Services Administration.) Currently the catalog has no specialties for this dual degree program (p. 315 and 316). Please clarify what your unit is proposing, two specialties in this dual major or are you proposing a concentration in Health Services Administration? If you are proposing two specialties for this major, it simplifies the process and keeps it consistent with your other specialties.

Please address these points, make the changes, and incorporate the suggestions stated above. If the changes or suggestions seem to be out of order, please specify why in your response. After completing these, send an updated electronic file or files of your revised academic approval form, proposal, and any other revised companion documents as attached files accompanying an email to me with a copy to Mary Martin. Once everything has been completed, we will schedule this back for committee discussion. We would like for you or a suitable representative to attend that meeting when it gets set up to discuss your proposal. Our future meetings are planned for Feb. 13 and 27. Larry Purnell will be able to attend either or both of these dates.

#### MS IN HEALTH SERVICES ADMINISTRATION

The School of Nursing offers a major in Health Services Administration leading to a Master of Science degree. Admission to the major requires that students fulfill the following requirements:

- 1.Completion of a Bachelor's degree in a health-related field, such as nutrition/dietetics, sports medicine/exercise science, physical therapy, occupational therapy, public policy, information sci-
- ences, health education, and health promotion and wellness. 2.Completion of one year of management experience in a health-
- related field or three years experience in professional healthrelated practice. 3.Satisfactory performance in undergraduate academic work as
- well as in upper division major courses. 4.Three satisfactory academic and/or professional recommenda-
- tions.
- 5.Interview with faculty from the graduate program.

- 6.Submission of a personal statement concerning goals related to health services administration.
- For students for whom English is not a primary language, a minimum score of 600 for the paper test or 250 for the computer based test is required on the Test of English as a Foreign Language. These students may be required to take the Test of Spoken English.

#### REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DEGREE

- 1.Completion of a minimum of 36 credits (21 credits of department core requirements; 6 credits of research design and statistics; 6 credits of non-College requirements; and 3 credits of free elective).
- 2. Three credits of practicum, which may be taken together or in one-credit blocks.

3.Writing of a Scholarly Project.

4.A colloquium presentation on the Scholarly Project.

- -Submission of Nursing Employment Verification Form

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background checks, drug screenings, and CPR requirements prior to clinical coursework and direct patient care. Additional requirements for the clinical education may be required by the healthcare agency to which a student is assigned. Students are expected to provide their own transportation to all required clin-ical experimences ical experiences.
