Specifically, the reports documents that:

- External Reviews of the Department of Animal and Food Sciences and the majors in October 2013 found no major issues.
- The majors are consistent the University's Path to Prominence.
- The majors have demonstrated that they are meeting their stated goals and objectives.
- The majors are comparable with similar majors at highly-ranked schools.
- The majors are meeting the General Education Goals of the University.
- The majors are attracting high quality applicants.
- The majors are graduating, and getting jobs and accepted to high-quality graduate and pre-veterinary programs.
- No significant additional resources are required to support these majors.
- The Department Chair and Dean have provided letters of support for the majors.
