Minutes:

- 1. Details regarding new website and digital library display were discussed.
 - The current photos in the library will be converted to a digital display.
 - OCM will be contacted to work on the display, and other possible ways of recognizing winners. The winner's photos will also be scrolled on the new website.
- 2. The new community engagement award was discussed.
 - It can be advertised as other awards, and also via the Community Engagement Leadership Council (which is quite large).
 - It is a faculty award.
- 3. Change to advising award.
 - The write-up of this award, and all others will be looked at. This award in particular could be clarified since students seem to be nominating professional staff advisors and not faculty.
- 4. Formation of a career teaching award
 - This idea is supported by the committee.
 - The committee also feels the other awards (teaching and Advising) should only be won one time.
- 5. Potential changes to the criteria for the mid-career scholarship award.
 - Should this be restricted to faculty up until 2 years after promotion to full professor?
- 6. Retention of Alison nomination information?
 - Historic information on nominations should be kept.
 - Nominees should be active for two years if the nominating dean so wished.
 Materials can be updated is desired.
- 7. Timing of nominations to spread out the workload?
 - If we get a Career Teaching award, it should have the same deadline and process as the Alison award. The deadline is April 1.
 - The Faculty Teaching Awards, Graduate Student Teaching Awards, and Advising Awards will remain on the current schedule.
 - The Mid-Career Scholarship Awards, and the Community Engagement Award should have a fall deadline.
