REGULAR MEETING OF THE UNIVERSITY FACULTY SENATE

September 8, 1975

MINUTES

The regular meeting of the University Faculty Senate was called to order at 4:05 p.m. Senators not in attendance were:

The proposed Agenda was adopted without dissent.

The minutes of the last regular Senate meeting on May 5, 1975 and of two Special Senate meetings on May 12 and May 28, 1975 were approved as written.


President Braun made the following announcements:

The amended report from the Ad Hoc Committee to Develop a Student Judicial System which was adopted as "the sense of the Senate" at the May 28 meeting was also adopted by the Board of Trustees at its May 31, 1975 meeting. The resulting change in the Trustee Bylaws, Chapter 2, III, E, clarifying the duties and activities of the faculty and the Vice President for Student Affairs, reads as follows:

"Under the direction of the President, the Vice President for Student Affairs shall develop, coordinate and implement the total program of student services consistent with regulations promulgated by the faculty and trustees, including the following specific functions: admissions and records, orientation of new students (excluding the formal orientation courses taught in the colleges of the University), financial aid, counseling and testing, student development, and extracurricular activities (including student qovernment, student publications, fraternities, sororities, and other social, religious and cultural out-ofclass activities, but excluding intercollegiate and intramural athletics), student health services, student housing and food services, and shall establish and administer the Student Judicial System consistent with the philosophy formulated by the Faculty."

The tenure policy as adopted by the Senate was also approved by the Board of Trustees on July 14, 1975, with one change.

Paragraph 2 now reads:

"With the exception of Visiting Professors, and except as otherwise provided under Item 7, tenure is awarded to FULL PROFESSORS on initial appointment or on promotion to this rank."

Because the recommendations for changes in the time schedule for promotion procedures which were made by the Senate Committee on Promotion and Tenure in their 1974-75 Annual Report were not placed on the Senate agenda they cannot be acted upon by the Senate for implementation this year. However, Prof. John Wriston, Chairperson of the Committee, urges that all participants adhere to the recommended schedule. The schedule is as follows:

FROM

Dec. 1 - Department recommendations to the dean.

Jan. 15 - Dean's recommendation to the Provost and University Committee on Promotion and Tenure

March 1 - Committee on Promotion and Tenure and Provost's recommendations.

TO

Nov. 1 - Unit Promotion Committee's and Unit Head's recommendations due at the dean's or director's office.

Dec. 15 - College or division promotion committee's, and dean's or director's recommendations due at Provost's Office.


March 15 - University Committee on Promotion and Tenure's and Provost's recommendations forwarded to the President and the Board of Trustees.

President Braun reminded Senate members that any recommendations generated by Senate committee reports must be placed on the Senate schedule as official motions before they can be acted upon. He suggested that members wishing to have any action taken should request Vice President Catts to place the item on the agenda.

President Braun announced that there has been a change in the Faculty Senate office staff. Mrs. Patsy Erisman has left the position of Executive Secretary and she will be replaced by Mrs. Barbara Martin on September 22. Prof. Finner introduced the following motion:

The University Faculty Senate expresses its deepest appreciation for the time, enthusiastic dedication and outstanding performance Patsy Erisman has given as Executive Secretary for this body.

The motion was unanimously approved.


President Braun reported on some conversation he has had with Provost Campbell regarding proposals for changes in the Health Sciences program on the campus. It was President Braun's understanding that there would be no changes in course offerings or in curriculum in the current year, and that none would occur without the consent of the Senate. The committee which is studying the proposed changes will issue a report and recommendations to the Provost and he will forward them to the Senate for approval. In view of these facts present Senate action was not indicated nor recommended; changes being currently contemplated are administrative only. Provost Campbell, who was present, concurred in this understanding.

The proposal to form an Ad Hoc Committee on Retrenchment has been returned to the Committee on Committees and brought back to the Senate. Prof. Madelynn Oglesby, Chairperson, noted the following changes in the Committee's nominations: George Cicala to replace Stephen Finner as Chairperson nominee, and Willard Baxter to replace Heywood Brock. Nominee Carol Hoffecker has not yet been contacted by the Committee.

A motion was introduced to consider the proposal in three sections: the charge, the membership criteria, and the membership nominations. The motion passed unanimously. The Senate then considered the Charge to the Committee and the role of the Committee in relation to collective bargaining, COPE, and the administration. President Braun called the question: "Should an Ad Hoc Committee to the Faculty Senate on Retrenchment be established and its charge be as stated in the proposal." The affirmative vote was unanimous.

After discussion of the membership criteria a motion was made to change the last sentence of the last paragraph to read: "at least one voting Committee member shall be an administrator holding faculty rank." The change was approved with 3 abstentions. Provost Campbell introduced a motion to delete Item 4 (the Assistant Provost for Budget Planning and Evaluation) from the membership list; after discussion the motion was approved. A motion to delete the membership criteria section was defeated, and a motion to keep the section as listed in Items 1, 2, 3 and the final paragraph as amended, was approved.

After discussion of the nominees the Senate approved a call to question and the slate was approved as amended earlier. A motion was introduced that the Committee on Committees be given the authority to appoint two persons to the Retrenchment Committee to fill the authorized vacancies; the motion was approved unanimously.

After discussion with Prof. Latham, Chairperson of the Ad Hoc Committee on Teaching Effectiveness, a motion was made and seconded to receive the report of the Committee, to discharge the Committee with thanks, and to request the Committee on Committees to prepare a recommendation to establish a Senate Committee on Teaching Effectiveness to report in November. The motion was passed with one objection.


After discussion with Professor Mark Sharnoff of the Committee on Student and Faculty Honors, an amendment to the Committee's recommended resolution was introduced to require the colleges to submit their criteria for degrees with honors for the approval of the Faculty Senate. The amendment was approved. The question was then called to accept the resolution as amended and the resolution was defeated. The present system will remain in effect.

A motion was made to refer the proposed resolution from Professor Leroy V. Svec calling for the dissolution of the University Faculty Senate Committee on Promotions and Tenure to the Committee on Committees and was approved unanimously.

A motion to adjourn was made, seconded and approved and the meeting was adjourned at 5:40 p.m.


